CITY COUNCIL RETREAT

The City Council and City management staff gathered for the annual retreat on February 8. In past years, the time was used for a wide variety of City issues. This year was slightly different, as participants focused the majority of the day upon the City's Capital Improvement Plan and the infrastructure needs that must be addressed now and in the future to be the City citizens want and deserve.

After reviewing a comprehensive list of capital improvements, each council person identified what they felt to be priorities. These discussions will continue during a work session currently scheduled for March 26 prior to the Council meeting. Community input is encouraged on efforts to improve Heath's roads, parks, trails and water and sewer systems.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

Heath citizens approved the sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption in the General Election last May. This enhances the City's ability to attract high quality retail development that will further expand the tax base. To date, two businesses have received permits to sell beer and wine.

The Heath Economic Development Corporation is working with urban planner, Paris Rutherford of Catalyst Urban Development, to guide commercial and retail development efforts. Concept plans and zoning regulations that uphold the vision for an upscale, attractive community are in the works for targeted areas where developer/property owner partners have approached the City.

The HEDC is also investing in upgraded street signage. The attractive new sign posts and plates reflect the high-quality brand established for the City. You can see examples of these signs if you wish to stop by City Hall.

Upsize Your Household Recycling Capacity!

Every year, the United States generates approximately 230 million tons of "trash"--about 4.6 pounds per person per day, according to www.learning.org. More than 70 percent of what ends up in the landfill could be recycled.

Increase your capacity to recycle household waste by exchanging your 64-gallon blue recycling polycart for a 95-gallon recycling polycart. The enlarged cart is \$1 extra per month. Please call City Hall at 972-771-6228 if you want to upsize!

Active Wildlife

It is breeding season for wildlife. That means animals are more active and feeling bolder about coming onto your property. To help avoid unwanted visitors like coyotes, do not put pet food outside. Also be careful about leaving your pets unattended outdoors.

Mosquitoes

Last year's outbreak of the West Nile Virus in surrounding North Texas communities is a good reason to start taking precautionary steps now to keep your family safe.

As you tackle spring clean-up projects, pay attention to window and door screens that need to be repaired or replaced. Also look around your property for possible mosquito breeding places. Be sure to empty water from buckets, cans, pool covers, flowerpots, and other items.

Throw away or cover up stored tires or items that aren't being used. Clean pet water bowls weekly. Check if rain gutters are clogged. If you store water outside or have a well, make sure it's covered up. Encourage your neighbors to do the same.
