A traffic accident is never a happy incident, but the City of Heath Department of Public Safety has made obtaining a copy of your accident report easier and faster by providing online access at www.heathtx.com. In most cases, reports will be available within 24 hours of the accident.

#### To search for a report you will need:

- 1. The Accident Report Number
- 2. The Location of the Accident
- 3. Your Driver's License Number

The fee for each report is \$6.00 and payable by a major debit or credit card. Accident reports can still be obtained in person at the Heath DPS office located at 200 Laurence Dr., Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The cost in person is also \$6.00. IESI BI-MONTHLY BRUSH PICK UP

Please remember that you can place your brush curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the first and third Mondays for collection that week. The amount of brush hauled away free of charge is three cubic yards. Anything over three cubic yards will continue to be billed at \$10 per yard. Residential customers also now have the option of exchanging their 64-gallon blue recycling polycart for a 95-gallon recycling polycart. The enlarged cart is \$1 extra per month. ## Fun Facts about Your Hometown...

- Heath was named for John O. Heath, who in 1846 became one of the earliest settlers in the area.
- Heath was originally known as Black Hill—a reference to the black soil of the area—and received a post office, the first in what is now Rockwall County, in 1849.
- In 1854, the post office was moved to nearby Rockwall. From this time until 1886 the settlement was known as Willow Springs, after a local stream.
- In 1886, the name became Heath, and the town again received a post office, which operated until 1906.
