### City Council Adopts Budget for 2014-2015 Fiscal Year

The Heath City Council unanimously adopted a budget for the Fiscal Year 2014-2015 at the September 23 City Council meeting. The budget includes an Ad Valorem property tax rate increase of 8.33-cents, which is the first increase in 22 years. The 8.33 cents is distributed as follows:

- 1 cent is to fund maintenance and operations (M&O), which includes Public Safety, Public Works and Administration. Numerous additions to the budget were responsive to the City's growth and include two new part-time Public Safety Officers, a Permit Clerk and a Construction Inspector. The budget also included an increase in funding for street repairs and maintenance.
- 7.33 cents will fund debt service (I&S). The proceeds from the debt are used to fund more than \$20 million in capital improvement projects that benefit the entire City including street, trail and park projects. You can view the project list in a table on the next page, or via an online map at www.heathtx.com under the Government menu.
- The average taxable value of a home in Heath is \$406,450. The new tax rate will increase taxes \$338.57 annually. Of that increase, \$40.65 will go to M&O, and \$297.92 will fund the debt service.

The budget also includes a water rate increase due to a rate increase charged by the City's water supplier. The City of Heath's water supplier is the City of Rockwall, which is a member city of the North Texas Municipal Water District (NTMWD). The rate increase in the 2014-2015 budget is 19 cents per 1,000 gallons of water used.

## Annual Registration Reminders

**RESIDENTIAL & COMMERCIAL ALARM PERMITS EXPIRE DECEMBER 31** 

All commercial/residential alarm systems in the City of Heath require an annual permit for operation. All systems should be registered or renewed by January 1, 2015. The permit is good for a calendar year. A penalty of \$200.00 may be assessed if an alarm system permit is not current. A renewal form is included with this month's utility bill/newsletter. If you have questions, please contact Customer Service at 972-771-6228.

**Dog registrations also expire December 31 each year.** Please bring current rabies certification to City Hall to update or obtain your dog's registration tag. The annual cost is \$10 for intact dogs and \$5 for those that have been spayed or neutered.
