Stage 3 Water Restrictions: Updated and Effective November 1, 2014

Effective November 1, landscape watering with sprinklers or irrigation systems is now limited to ONCE EVERY TWO WEEKS ON THE DAY OF YOUR CHOICE. No watering is allowed on any day between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.



Annual Registration Reminders

RESIDENTIAL & COMMERCIAL ALARM PERMITS EXPIRE ON DECEMBER 31

Anyone who has a commercial or residential alarm system in the City of Heath is required to obtain an annual permit for operation of the system. All alarm systems should be registered or renewed by January 1, 2015. The permit is good for a calendar year. A penalty of \$200.00 may be assessed if an alarm system permit is not current. You can download a form at www.heathtx.com under the Department of Public Safety menu or obtain one at City Hall. If you have questions, please contact Customer Service at 972-771-6228.

DOGS

Dog registrations also expire December 31 each year. Please bring current rabies certification to City Hall to update or obtain your dog's registration tag. The annual cost is \$10 for intact dogs and \$5 for those that have been spayed or neutered.

Brennen Teel Foundation For Gas Line Safety



Hearts were broken throughout Rockwall County on August 24, 2012 when Brennan Teel's life was tragically taken due to a lightning strike at the Lubbock home he was visiting.

His friends unknowingly had yellowjacketed Corrugated Stainless Steel Tubing (CSST) installed in their home. The Lubbock fire marshal blamed the fatal home fire on this tubing, which is used to pipe gas to furnaces and appliances in many newer homes.

While nothing can ever bring back this cherished son, brother and friend,

Brennen's family was driven to do something to honor Brennan and founded the Heath-based Brennan Teel Foundation for Gas Line Safety.

"The Brennen Teel Foundation for Gas Line Safety provides education and builds awareness about the untold dangers of yellow-jacketed CSST," said Lavera Vincent, executive director. "While saving lives and protecting property, we are using the Voice of ONE

for the safety of many."

"Brennen Teel called Heath home, and his parents, Ken and Becky, have been invested in Rockwall County for 29 years raising their family, engaging in the neighborhood and providing economic growth for their community," adds Lavera. "This is where we will continue Brennan's legacy through our work."
