City Council Approves 2016-2017 Fiscal Budget with Reduction in Tax Rate

At the regular meeting on September 20, City Council adopted a balanced budget that reduces the tax rate for Heath citizens while funding the addition of a new Public Safety Officer, a Streets and Parks Maintenance staff member and a Parks Action Plan for improving and expanding the City's parks system.

The budget was prepared with a tax rate of 41.7311 cents per \$100 of property value. This is a reduction of 0.9289 cents per \$100 from the current rate of 42.66 cents.

"I want to thank my fellow City Council members and staff for their hard work on the budget, as well as the many citizens who gave us valuable input," said Mayor Brian Berry. "I'm very excited that we were able to lower the tax rate, and at the same time address important needs."

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2016-2017 BUDGET INCLUDE:

- 1. General Operating Budget of \$6,289,500
- 2. Total Assessed Value of \$1,407,784,869
- 3. One Additional Public Safety Officer
- 4. New Streets and Parks Maintenance Position
- 5. Parks Action Plan for Improving and Expanding City Park System
- 6. Equipment for Utilities Department

"Wise stewardship of our budget combined with an investment in current and future Capital Improvements Plans is critical as we continue to oversee quality development as we manage essentially the doubling of rooftops in Heath in the coming years," added Mayor Berry.

We Got the GOLD! CITY OF HEATH EARNS PROMINENT SCENIC CITY RE-CERTIFICATION AND UPGRADE

The City of Heath was not only re-certified as a Texas Scenic City in 2016, but was upgraded from Silver to Gold status.

The new designation was presented at a reception held during the Texas Municipal League's 2016 Annual Conference in Austin in October. Mayor Brian Berry (front center) along with Councilmembers Rich Krause (front left) and John Main (front right) accepted the honor presented by Scenic City representatives (back).

Scenic City Texas' certification program recognizes Texas municipalities that implement high-quality scenic standards for public roadways and public spaces. Once the certification is earned, cities must re-apply every five years and be evaluated by over 70 strict criteria ranging from sign, lighting, litter and graffiti ordinances to parks, trails and open spaces.

Other D/FW area cities earning the certification in 2016 included Fort Worth, Frisco, Fairview, Cedar Hill, Denton and North Richland Hills. Only 66 cities statewide have earned this distinction.

ANNUAL REGISTRATION REMINDERS RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL ALARM PERMITS EXPIRE ON DECEMBER 31

Renewal form included with this month's utility bill/newsletter

Anyone who has a commercial or residential alarm system in the City of Heath is required to obtain an annual permit for the operation of the system. All alarm systems should be registered or renewed by January 1, 2017. The permit is good for a calendar year. A penalty of \$200 may be assessed if an alarm system permit is not current. A renewal form is included with this month's utility bill/newsletter. You can also electronically submit or download the form at www.heathtx.com under the Department of Public Safety menu or obtain a hard copy at City Hall.
