# **HEATH CITY COUNCIL VOTES TO MOVE FORWARD** WITH IMPORTANT COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

The Heath City Council reviewed a Plan of Finance from the City's financial advisor to fund close to \$20 million in new Capital Improvement Plan projects and approved a Resolution Authorizing Publication of Notice of Intent to issue Combination Tax and Surplus Revenue Certificates of Obligation during its October 25 meeting.

"As a result of the City's astute and proactive financial management, you are in an excellent situation to pursue this Plan of Finance for issuing these bonds," said Jim Sabonis, Managing Director of FirstSouthwest, when he presented the Finance Plan for the new CIP projects. "Your cash management practices are saving citizens money, and your tax rate remains among the lowest of any city with which we work."

The Plan of Finance presented by Sabonis encompasses the financing of approximately \$6,615,400 to fund various projects including streets, parks/ trails, a fire truck and municipal building improvements. The Combination Tax and Surplus Revenue Certificates of Obligation issued are not anticipated to impact the current tax rate.

The plan also includes \$13 million to fund critical water and sewer infrastructure to serve a growing community. The Combination Tax and Surplus Revenue Certificates of Obligation are anticipated to increase current utility bills by \$6 per month.

"I am excited about the opportunity to continue an aggressive approach to launching and completing Capital Improvement Plan projects that are much needed, and in some cases, past due," said Mayor Brian Berry. "Many are necessary to ensure that we deliver water and sewer services to a growing community in compliance with state and federal mandates."

"We are committed to ensuring a high quality of life and sustaining Heath's reputation as a premier DFW community, and we are very pleased that these critical projects can be addressed with an anticipated minimal financial impact on the citizens we serve," said Mayor Berry."

According to the Financial Plan presented by Sabonis, the Heath City Council will consider and approve issuance of the bonds in January 2017. Sabonis noted that "near historically-low interest rates" made the timing of the bond issuance another positive factor of the financial plan.

- Jeff Boyd waterline (12" water line extension along FM-549 and Jeff Boyd) - construction started

- Hubbard Drive roadway Improvements (reconstruction of sections of Hubbard Drive, including drainage improvements, FM-740 to south Scenic Drive) - the engineering has started

## TXDOT UPDATE ON FM 740 WIDENING PROJECT

The contractor has started installing the roadway base on one side of FM 740, beginning at the Smirl intersection in front of City Hall and Amy Parks Elementary, down to the new intersection at FM-550 and the section of FM-740 in front of the high school and up to the CVS. Once this side is completed, the traffic will be switched over to the new pavement. The switch is anticipated to occur in late February/early March. Once the traffic is moved to the new pavement, the contractor will start the other side of the roadway. The entire FM-740 project is scheduled to be completed late August 2017.

# ANNUAL REGISTRATION REMINDERS

**RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL** 

**ALARM PERMITS EXPIRE ON DECEMBER 31** RENEWAL FORM INCLUDED WITH THIS MONTH'S UTILITY BILL/NEWSLETTER

Anyone who has a commercial or residential alarm system in the City of Heath is required to obtain an annual permit for the operation of the system. All alarm systems should be registered or renewed by January 1, 2017.

The permit is good for a calendar year. A penalty of \$200 may be assessed if an alarm system permit is not current. A renewal form is included with this month's utility bill/newsletter. You can also electronically submit or download the form at www.heathtx.com<a href="http://www.heathtx.com">www.heathtx.com</a> under the Department of Public Safety menu or obtain a hard copy at City Hall.

Dog registrations also expire December 31 each year. Please bring current rabies certification to City Hall to update or obtain your dog's registration tag. The annual cost is \$10 for intact dogs and \$5 for those that have been spayed
