COMMUNITY KICKS OFF EASTER AT FUN & FIT IN THE PARK FEATURING HEART OF HEATH 5K AND 1-MILE FAMILY RUN

The Heath community celebrated Easter Saturday on April 15 at Fun & Fitness in the Park, featuring the annual Heart of Heath 5k and One-Mile Family Run.

A record-breaking 411 participants entered the two runs.

Locals placing high included Jordan Newcomer of Rockwall, who took 3rd place in the 5k with a 17:14 time. The Overall Female 5k winner was Alexis Williamson of Rockwall at 20:59; coming in 2nd place was Wendy Kreminski of Heath at 22:02; and 3rd place was Kathy Spletter of Rockwall at 22:22. Kremenski was also the Overall Female Masters 5k winner.

The most exuberant winners of the day were the Top 3 Boys and Top 3 Girls in the 1-Mile Family Run. These up-and-comers were: Madeline Hernandez, 1st place girl; Isabella Ruffo, 2nd place; and Kylie Wingard, 3rd place. Nathan McCowen was the 1st place boy; Dyson Wicker, 2nd place; and Zachary Wingard, 3rd place.

Fun & Fit in the Park activities also included complimentary refreshments, giant games like checkers, and an Easter craft in the Artstream Mobile Art Studio.

CITY RECEIVES FINANCIAL ACCOLADES

The City's financial statements for the 2015-2016 fiscal year once again received an Unmodified Opinion from independent auditors, which is the best of the four types of opinions that the City could have received.

Brooks Cardiel & Company, PLLC, conducted the audit and praised the City of Heath for its best practices in consistently maintaining conservative fiscal management, policies and procedures that have resulted in a balanced budget and healthy reserve fund balance. "Heath is one of the best managed cities that I have seen," said Louis Breedlove, audit manager, Brooks Cardiel & Company, PLLC during his presentation of the firm's audit results during the March 28 City Council meeting.

The City was also recently awarded a Certificate of Excellence in Financial Reporting by the Government Finance Officers Association of the U.S. and Canada (GFOA) for the seventh consecutive year. Additionally, the City received the GFOA's Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for the sixth time.

HEATH FAQS: BUILDING PERMITS

WHEN IS A BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED?

Any time you or your contractor constructs, repairs, alters, erects, enlarges, converts, installs or replaces an existing building or its utility system(s). Work that begins without a permit is subject to fines up to \$500.

Examples of projects that require a permit are:

- Fences
- Storage Sheds over 120 sq ft.
- Retaining Walls
- Swimming Pools
- Swimming Pool Repairs that Require Draining the Pool
- Interior Remodels & Additions
- Outdoor Kitchens/Fireplaces
- OSSF Replacements/Repairs
- Cabanas, Guest Houses
- Sea Wall Repairs/Replacements
- Roofing
- Window Replacements
- Foundation Repair
- Miscellaneous Plumbing, Electrical or Mechanical work
- Irrigation Systems

Items accepted for recycling include: televisions, computer monitors, laptops, printers, hard drives, fax machines, gaming consoles, VCR's, cell phones, radios, cables and cords, networking equipment, routers, servers, lab equipment, test equipment, flat panel displays, CPUs, keyboards, mice, tape and zip drivers, microwave ovens, DVD players, telephones, digital cameras, stereo components, power supplies, modems, switches, printed circuit boards, video conference equipment, ink and toner cartridges, batteries, aluminum cans, and eye glasses for Lion's club.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, in 2015, 818 cyclists were killed in motor vehicle related accidents in the US. That is more than two people per day.

As the weather warms up, more and more cyclists will be taking to the streets around Heath. With current road construction projects and lane closures, motorists are encouraged to pay even more attention to other road users and pedestrians.

CYCLISTS HAVE THE RIGHT TO USE THE ROAD

The Texas Transportation Code allows cyclists the same rights and duties as other vehicle operators (sec. 551.101). This means cyclists may take up the whole lane if necessary, and motorists should yield to them as they would to any other vehicle. Cyclists should travel in the same direction as traffic (sec 551.103), obey all traffic signs and use hand signals to indicate their intentions to motorists. Abide by traffic laws, stay focused, have patience and everyone can share the road safely.
