Semi-Annual ALPR Usage Review

Overview

The Heath Department of Public Safety utilized the ALPR System 724 times over the past six months. This report provides a detailed review of system usage, compliance, and outcomes during this reporting period.

Data Retention and Compliance

The ALPR system only permits a 30-day search for captured images. Beyond this period, images are automatically deleted. It is confirmed that all images older than 30 days have been removed from the Heath Department of Public Safety's access and the ALPR vendor database.

Definitions

- **Alerts:** Results from vehicle license plate information linked to protective order, sex offender, stolen plate, warrants, violent person, stolen vehicle, and missing person.
- **System Maintenance:** Includes installation, necessary replacements, or repairs of system components.

Highlights of System Performance

- The system generated 1,305 alerts over the reporting period, contributing to 4 arrests.
- Maintenance was minimal with the addition of 2 cameras.

Transparency and Accountability

The ALPR system contributed to resolving multiple criminal cases during this reporting period.

No complaints regarding misuse of the camera data were filed.

All searches were conducted for approved law enforcement investigations or training purposes.

The department ALPR policy was reviewed and all members completed updated training.

The comprehensive analysis of this data confirms that the Heath Department of Public Safety has fully complied with all departmental policies and implemented robust safeguards to ensure responsible usage.
