TXDOT FM 740 PROJECT UPDATE

TxDOT began the construction phase of the FM-740 widening project from FM 1140 north to FM 1140 south in July. This is an important project for Heath and well worth the little bit of extra time daily travels around town will require during the construction phases. The contractor anticipates a completion date in the winter of 2017.

NEW STREET SIGNS GOING UP



Council members unanimously approved a bid during the July 28 City Council for the assembly and installation of 55 new street signs. Phase one of the project will include 42 signs located at the intersections with TxDOT roadways - excluding the portion of FM 740, which is now under construction - and street signs along Hubbard Drive and Horizon Road.

The next phase of the project is scheduled for 2016. New residential developments underway will be constructed with the new signage. The street sign project was spearheaded and funded by the Heath Municipal Benefits Corporation using sales tax revenue.

ROCKWALL COUNTY RANKS HIGH AGAIN!

Rockwall County ranked 6th on the Top 10 List of Texas counties with the strongest local investment and economic expansion, the *Dallas Business Journal* recently reported. Rockwall County had a high showing in each factor gauged in the SmartAsset study, including business growth, gross domestic product growth, new building permits and municipal bond investment. Collin County ranked 5th in the state, and Dallas County was 8th. The study used data taken between 2010 and 2012 by the U.S. Census Bureau

HEATH AND ROCKWALL WELCOME THE U.S. OPEN TRIATHLON AND 5K OCTOBER 18 REGISTRATION DISCOUNT EXTENDED TO HEATH RESIDENTS

Triathletes from all over the world will travel to Heath and Rockwall in October to race in the U.S. Open, the largest triathlon event in the D/FW area. They will swim 1500 meters in Lake Ray Hubbard, bike 24.8 miles and run 6.2 miles. A segment of the bike route will come through Heath. Cyclists and runners will be given the right of way on the roads that are part of the course.
