2018 PARKS, RECREATION AND TRAILS MASTER PLAN ADOPTED

The City Council unanimously adopted the 2018 City of Heath Parks, Recreation and Trails Master Plan at its May 22 meeting. The plan will serve as an actionoriented guide for planning and funding additions and enhancements to the park and trail system citywide.

"This is a very important investment in the quality of life enjoyed by current and future citizens that will also contribute to the City's status as a premier community," said Mayor Kelson Elam.

"The planning effort included many opportunities for Council, the Park Board, staff and the public to engage with *la terra studio's* consulting team to develop a true vision for parks and recreation in Heath," added Park Board Chairman Mark King. "We are excited about implementing this plan and what it will do for the future of Heath."

HEATH EDC/MBC HOSTS JOINT WORK SESSION ON THE TOWNE CENTER VISION

The Heath Economic Development Corporation/Municipal Benefits Corporation Board hosted a Joint Work Session on the Vision for the Towne Center at City Hall on June 7. Participating in the meeting were representatives from the Park Board and the Architectural Standards Review Committee.

"Now that the Comprehensive Plan, the Parks, Recreation and Trails Master Plan and the Architectural Committee's recommendations for our Towne Center have been completed, we have the guidelines our board needs for leading a collaborative effort to create the unique, distinctive Towne Center our citizens have said they want through various engagement efforts," said HEDC/HMBC President David Lane.

"There will be considerable planning and work ahead involving multi-group collaboration, but we are extremely excited to be a proactive driver for the creation and execution of the vision," he added.

The mission of the HEDC/HMBC is to retain and attract distinctive economic development that meets the City's vision for a premier community, expand the City's sales tax base and enhance the quality of life enjoyed by citizens.

"Simply put, we are charged with re-investing citizens' sales tax dollars to sustain our Heath lifestyle with funding generated through upscale, desired, and targeted retail and commercial development that retains the look and feel desired while continuing to enhance our community," said Mr. Lane.

 Appraisal and branding of 25 acres of land owned by the MBC along Chris Cuny Parkway and adjacent to the 50 acres of city-owned land.
- Ground lease agreement for MBC land with Hidden Creek Special Events Venue.

CAPITAL **IMPROVEMENTS UPDATE**

The Capital Improvement Plan continues to progress, providing upgrades and improvements to our City infrastructure.

COMPLETED PROJECTS

- Dennis Bailey Drive/Rabbit Ridge Phase 1 (adjacent to Ridge Lakes subdivision)
- Rabbit Ridge and Horizon Rd. Extension (Adjacent to Cobblestone Subdivision)
- Shepherds Glen Force Main and Gravity Sewer
- Woodbridge Lift Station
- Country Club Drive Rehabilitation
- Amy Parks Driveway (Towne Center Park)
- Stoneleigh Pedestrian Crossing
- Utilities Relocation for Next Phase of TxDOT FM-740 Widening
- Safe Routes to School Trails
- Buffalo Creek Trail Repair along Horizon Road
- New Lake Wall at Terry Park
- Multiple Utility Improvements to Facilitate Current and Future Residential and Commercial Development
- McDonald Rd. Improvements Phase $\dot{\textbf{1}}$ (FM-550 to Stoneleigh Subdivision Connection)
- 18 Streets included in the On-going Citywide Street Repair Program
- Towne Center Baseball Rehabilitation
- Jeff Boyd Waterline (12" water line extension along FM-549 and Jeff Boyd)

PROJECTS NOW UNDERWAY

- Rabbit Ridge Phase 2 (Ridge Lakes subdivision to FM-550 Includes 12"
- water Line) Obtaining right-of-way; plans 85% complete.
 Myers/Crisp Roadway Improvements The project is scheduled to begin in July. Construction time is estimated to be 7 to 9 months.
- Hubbard Drive Roadway Improvements (reconstruction of sections of Hubbard Drive, including drainage improvements, FM-740 to south Scenic Drive) - Engineering has started. Additional right-of-way will be needed for the project.
- 3 Million Gallon Ground Storage Tank and Pump Station Expansion -Construction has begun and will be completed February 2019.
- McDonald Road Phase 2 Roadway Project (Phase 1 to City Limits: Falcon Point Subdivision):
 - Right-of-way is obtained. New right-of-way will reduce the amount of one-lane roadway during construction. Private utilities will have to be relocated before the project will be bid. Once started, construction time is estimated to be 6 to 7 months.
