The newly-formed Heath Farmers Market Committee promises a farmers market for the fall of 2019. Location and details are still in the works, so stay tuned. With our road through downtown now complete, more services and amenities are popping up in our town center.

Tom Thumb and the Rockwall Area Chamber hosted a ground-breaking on December 5 for the new store and retail center now under construction at FM 740/FM 549/FM 550. "What makes your Hometown Heath so wonderful is what makes us so ecstatic to be here," said Connie Yates, Public Affairs & Communications Director of Tom Thumb.

"This is going to be a shopable, walkable, quaint-feeling hometown grocer," added Doug Campbell, Vice President of Marketing. Amenities will include a Starbucks with indoor and outdoor seating; a full-scale meat and seafood department with fresh, flown-in products; a florist offering custom arrangements as well as pick-up-and-go choices; a wide variety of hot food offerings including a Wok bar; a salad bar; and a fresh-cut fruit and juice bar.

"We are grateful to the many people in our community who worked hard to attract a grocery store of the caliber of Tom Thumb to Heath, and then worked equally hard with the development and architectural team to ensure that the building and site designs were in line with our vision for Heath," said Mayor Kelson Elam. "This is going to be a high-quality amenity that provides convenience, enhances our quality of life, and keeps more sales tax dollars at work in our own community as we shop and dine locally."

CITY OF HEATH TO TEST SANITARY SEWER LINES IN JANUARY

Inspection crews will be conducting a physical survey of a portion of the City of Heath sanitary sewer system in January. This survey involves the opening and inspecting of manholes and sewer lines in the streets and easements. An important task of the survey will be the smoke testing of the sewer lines to locate breaks and defects in the sewer system.

The smoke that you may see coming from the vent stacks on houses or holes in the ground is harmless, has little odor, and creates no fire hazard. The smoke should not enter your home unless you have defective plumbing or dried up drain traps. If this occurs, you should consult your licensed plumber.

A map showing testing locations and additional information will be posted on the City's website in January. Homeowners and businesses in the areas being tested will also receive notification directly from the City.
