

BUSINESS SPOTLIGHT

Tom Thumb Express officially opened July 10 with \$1 per gallon gas for the first 100 customers! Officials with Tom Thumb were on hand to greet customers, including Cooper Richards, inset above left, the first person in line who had his gas pumped by Mayor Kelson Elam. The grocery store will open in the fall with grand opening festivities for the whole community. Developers of the retail center are expected to announce additional tenants soon.

Also close to opening is SouthRidge, located behind the CVS at FM 740/FM 1140. The entertainment venue will be anchored by Standard Service, which is relocating from Rockwall and nearly doubling in size to 4,500-squarefeet. SouthRidge will also feature an outdoor stage for live music and entertainment, two large green turf areas for fun and games, pickle ball courts, six fire pits, a food truck court and weekend market. You can take a "fly-over tour" of the venue by searching "Southridge" on the City website (select option 1 in the search results).

SouthRidge is a joint project with the Heath Economic Development Corporation and Heath Municipal Benefits Corporation (HEDC/HMBC), which provided grant and loan assistance for this new Heath amenity that will generate local sales tax revenue and enhance citizens' quality of life.

PARKS AND TRAILS ARE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT!

The HEDC/HMBC also funded a new pavilion for Antigua Bay Park and new lights for the back practice fields at Towne Center Park. Additionally, the board approved at its June 18 meeting funding to connect the trail constructed by the Tom Thumb developers through the new retail center all the way to the trail on Chris Cuny Boulevard. This connection supports the City's vision for a walkable/bikeable Town Center.

"The musical talent in this region is tremendous, and it would be a shame not to take advantage of what we have," said Councilman Frank New, who is spearheading the Farmers Market. "Each concert will take place immediately after the market closes at 4 p.m. and last until about 6 pm."

The concert venue will be located on the City-owned property next to the soccer fields in Town Center Park. Citizens just need to bring lawn chairs or a blanket, and relax and enjoy the music.

"My hope is that citizens will come out to shop, visit with friends and neighbors, and then relax and enjoy the free concert," said Councilman New.

The Heath Farmers Market is an invitation-only local market that showcases the bounties of the fall growing season. Committee members are vetting vendors located within the geographic region of Rockwall County and adjacent counties who offer organic produce, meat, seafood, artesian cheeses, specialty products and more. There will also be food trucks. The Heath Farmers Market is scheduled to be open from noon to 4 p.m. on Saturdays from September 28 through November 30.
