NEW SERVICE: WEEKLY HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

Beginning in mid-January, you will be able to schedule a weekly "front porch pickup" by HHW Solutions of items such as paint, motor oil, batteries, insecticides, fertilizers, pool chemicals and other household materials. These items are not accepted by regular trash collection services and are prohibited in landfills.

In addition to collecting household hazardous wastes, citizens can also set out up to 50 pounds of electronic items to be recycled.

The cost for this new service is 56 cents per household per month to residents. You do not have to be home to have items collected.

HHW Solutions will also sponsor an annual paper shredding event, where you can bring items to a central location for shredding. Shredded paper will then be recycled.

BY 8 P.M. MONDAY - Call 972-440-2040 or go online to www. HHWSolutions.com to request a pickup. There will be a City of Heath tab on the website

BY 7 A.M. WEDNESDAY - Place items to be collected on your front porch. If you have a gated property, please place your items at the curb.

The schedule will not change, except if impacted by holidays. If you have questions, contact the City at 972-771-6228.

8 REASONS WHY SUPPORTING Heath Businesses is good for our community

You can make a positive impact in Hometown Heath by simply shopping, dining and obtaining services from our local businesses.

HERE ARE 8 REASONS WHY:

- 1. More of your money will be kept in our local economy For every \$100 you spend at local businesses, \$68 will stay in the community*. Local sales taxes also help keep your property taxes from rising.
- 2. Your local sales tax dollars are re-invested in Heath Spending locally instead of online or in another city ensures that your sales tax dollars are re-invested where they belong - in Heath! In the past 5 years, the HEDC/HMBC has invested \$687,669 of your sales tax dollars in community improvements such as the new street signs and numerous park and trails improvements. In its 2019-2020 annual budget, the HEDC/HMBC committed 25% of its annual sales tax revenue back to more community improvements. Your local spending increases the funding available for these investments in Heath, all of which contribute to our quality of life, enhanced property values and lower property taxes.

3. You create local jobs

Local businesses mean local jobs for your family, friends and neighbors.

4. You nurture community

Local businesses care about our community and generously support our schools, churches, city events and activities, and Heath's first responders. For example, Tom Thumb provided Thanksgiving and Christmas meals for the Heath DPS officers on duty on these holidays and many local businesses also sponsor the City of Heath's Special Events and countless RISD activities and programs.

5. You help the environment

Buying locally conserves energy and resources in the form of less fuel for transportation and all that packaging that comes with an online purchase.

The New Year brings the 2020 Census! Here's are the facts and why it's essential that everyone in Heath is counted.

- The U.S. Constitution requires a census every 10 years. The census covers the entire country. The first census was in 1790.
- Census data determines how more than \$675 billion are spent to support national, state and local programs.
- The results of the census ensure fair representation. Results are used to reapportion the U.S. House of Representatives, determining how many seats each state gets.
- State officials use the results to redraw the boundaries of their congressional and state legislative districts, adapting to population shifts.
- Local governments use the census for public safety and emergency preparedness.
- Businesses use census data to decide where to build factories, offices, stores and restaurants, which create jobs.

Taking part in the 2020 Census is a required part of your civic duty. By federal law, your census responses are confidential and can be used only to produce statistics. You will be able to respond to the census online or in print. Learn more about the 2020 Census including employment opportunities at census.gov.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS FROM CUSTOMER SERVICE

CREDIT CARD TRANSACTIONS

Beginning December 1, 2019, the City of Heath will charge a 3% convenience fee for credit card transactions.

ALARM PERMITS EXPIRE DECEMBER 31

Any one responsible for the operation of or in possession of an alarm system in the City of Heath is required to obtain an annual permit for operation of such system. The permit is good for a calendar year and a penalty of \$200 may be assessed if an alarm system permit is not current. The fee for a residential permit is \$35 per year. You can also register or renew your residential or commercial alarm permit online at heathtx.com under the Department of Public Safety page.

DOG REGISTRATION

Dog registrations also expire December 31 each year. Please bring current rabies certification to City Hall to update or obtain your dog's registration tag. The annual cost is \$10 for intact dogs and \$5 for those that have been spayed or neutered.
