As we ring in 2020, we celebrate a new decade of both milestones and firsts in Heath.

Founded in 1880, Heath turns 140 this year. Rush Creek Yacht Club just celebrated its 50th anniversary. The Annual Holiday in the Park was bigger and better than ever for its 25th Anniversary, with Amy Parks Honor Choir Director, Jan Stonestreet, closing out the Christmas Tree Lighting program with her current and past choir members singing *Super Santa* like they have every year since 1994.

The Inaugural Heath Farmers Market was held every Saturday in the fall, culminating with a great concert and our first official City fireworks display on November 30. Thanks to Rob Whittle and Heath Golf and Yacht Club for stepping up to sponsor the market and to the newly-formed Heath Volunteer Fireworks Committee for coordinating the show sponsored by the Heath Economic Development Corporation (EDC). The Heath EDC will be sponsoring more fireworks shows throughout the year, so stay tuned and plan to stay home for these events.

The Heath Hawks Band, Drill team and Cheerleaders assisted with the opening of the new 55,000-square-foot Tom Thumb grocery store. Although a stark contrast from the Terry General Store, Cullen Bait and Grocery and Brady's Grocery of the past, the Tom Thumb team is working hard to provide not only good products and services, but also a hometown, friendly feel.

The J.E.R. Chilton Rockwall YMCA began its first year of using our Towne Center Park fields for the youth soccer program and managing our City fields. Despite a rain-filled spring, the YMCA leadership is excited with the participation in Heath



and expects it to only increase in 2020. We look forward to building on this partnership to bring more activities to all citizens of Heath.

Parks And Trails Of Heath (PATH) was launched to engage citizens, organizations and businesses in creating a high-quality park and trail system. Thanks to our charter members and the Park Board for their vision and leadership in maintaining Heath's unique character. ## MARSHA'S HAPPY HAVEN AT TERRY PARK: A PLAYGROUND FOCUSED ON INCLUSION

{Dictionary: ha-ven: noun a place of safety or refuge}

If you know Heath resident and former Park Board Chairman Ginny Jackson, you know that she is driven by a fierce passion to create an inclusive haven where children can play and caregivers can rest and restore.

Mrs. Jackson's vision took a big leap towards reality on August 27, 2019 when the Heath City Council dedicated a .54 acre parcel of land at the waterfront Terry Park for a privately-funded all abilities playground.

Now Mrs. Jackson and friends, including long-time Heath resident Gini Seely (AKA "the Ginnies"), are spearheading fund raising efforts for a beautiful playground designed by Robert Luna of Middleman Luna Architects. Mr. Luna designed Morgan's Wonderland, the all-abilities amusement park in San Antonio.

Luna's concept design is situated on a small footprint in Terry Park, but it packs in a ton of fun with play structures and features that are wheelchair accessible, sensory friendly and safe for all. The features also allow wounded war veterans to enjoy some of the attractions and take part in playing with their children.

Unique elements include musical instruments, a platform with more than 50 items such as periscopes, and activities that answer every kid's love for climbing. Attractive shading and gating that enhances the lakefront setting will surround the playground to ensure each child's safety and every caregiver's peace-of-mind.

"We are so grateful for the incredible support of the City and community," said Mrs. Jackson. "Marsha's Happy Haven will be a small oasis of happiness and joy in a beautiful place that all citizens can be proud of and enjoy with their own families."

"I have nothing but admiration for the tireless tenacity and hard work that both Ginny Jackson and Gini Seely have poured into this endeavor," said Mayor Kelson Elam. "This will be a unique asset to the City of Heath's parks and trails system, and we look forward to continuing our private-public partnership to bring their vision to life."

To fund construction of Marsha's Happy Haven, Mrs. Jackson is seeking \$1.2 million in private donations. ### THE INSPIRATION BEHIND MARSHA'S HAPPY HAVEN

Mrs. Jackson's passion for developing an all inclusive park in Heath began in the early 1970's, when she met Marsha Waldie, a young girl who had Spina Bifida. "Marsha was three years old and confined to a tiny wheelchair, while my own young daughter was running and playing outside. This made a lasting impression on me," said Mrs. Jackson.

Marsha was not expected to live past the age of 20, but she didn't let this prognosis be a discouragement. She went to college, where she studied radio and television, and became a film editor in Dallas.

"Nothing stopped Marsha, and she ended up living to the age of 43," said Mrs. Jackson. "Her life is a great reminder of what you can achieve with strength and positivity. For that reason, we have dedicated Marsha's Happy Haven in her honor. We believe that all people, both those with and without special needs, should be able to enjoy a day at the park without limitations."


