DIRECT CREDIT CARD Draft Services No Longer Available

As of February 1, the City of Heath will no longer have the ability to offer recurring direct credit card draft services.

TAKE ADVANTAGE OF YOUR BULKY AND UNBUNDLED BRUSH SERVICES

Waste Collection Service Provides City of Heath Customers the following Waste and Recycling Services:

- Weekly trash and bulky item collection
- Monthly bulky item and brush pick up on the 1st and 3rd Monday of each month
- One 95-gallon rolling polycart with a lid provided for trash collection
- One 95-gallon rolling polycart with a lid provided for recyclables

Your Weekly Trash Collection includes:

- Emptying of the trash and recyclables poly carts
- Pick up of any other bags or bins set out
- Bulky items such as furniture
- Pick up of bundled brush or limbs (not to exceed 4 feet in length)

Weekly Bulky Waste Collection | Items Accepted:

- Brush Bundled in no more than 4 feet in length
- Furniture couch, chair, mattress, box springs, etc.
- Appliances (Freon must be removed & certified)
- Swing Sets (disassembled)
- Debris from minor home improvement projects (no more than 1 cubic yard)
- Cardboard Boxes (broken down)

Weekly Bulky Waste Collection | Items Not Accepted:

- Roofing materials
- Debris from construction, demolition or remodeling by a contractor
- Dirt, rocks or concrete
- Hazardous materials herbicides, pesticides, fertilizers, pool chemicals, etc.
- Tires, batteries and automobile parts
- Liquids paints, motor oil, solvents
- Electronics
- Wooden pallets

MONTHLY UNBUNDLED BRUSH COLLECTION

Brush and limbs that are not bundled or exceed the weekly size limit of 4 feet in length will be collected during the week of the 1st and 3rd Monday of each month.

- Items should be placed curbside by 7 a.m. on the 1st and 3rd Mondays.
- Unbundled brush should not be placed curbside more than three days prior to scheduled collection.
- You will be billed \$10 per cubic yard over 3 cubic yards.
- Size Example: 1 cubic yard = 7x 30-gallon trash bags, or a box that is 3 feet in length, height and width.

HOW TO BE MORE WILEY THAN THE COYOTE

The City of Heath and Heath DPS are aware of coyote sightings in various Heath neighborhoods and have consulted the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and Rockwall County Animal Control. Representatives with both entities note that the combination of Heath being a semi-rural community with cold weather and construction such as the new White Road results in more activity as wildlife seek shelter and food. This increase is becoming more common, even in suburban areas and cities.

The following tips were offered to help protect your household and pets:

- Remove anything that attracts pests and predator animals to your property, such as pet and livestock food dishes that are out in the open
- Mow down tall grass
- Keep pets indoors, or supervise them during the night when they go outside
- Enclose your compost piles
- Seal up any openings under your deck, porch, or shed

INSTALL FENCING

Fencing is the best way to keep your pets in, and coyotes out. Coyotes can jump high, and will dig as well, so fencing should be at least 6 feet tall, and buried a few inches into the ground. Some people also opt for electric fencing.

INSTALL SOLAR LED DETERRENT OR MOTION DETECTOR LIGHTS

LED predator deterrent lights are available and can help scare coyotes (and other nocturnal predators and pest animals) away from your property. The coyotes will mistake the twin LED lights for the flickering eyes of another unknown predator. To find this product online, search "predator deterrent lighting".
