FOLLOW THE DESIGN HEATH TOWNE CENTER AND TOWNE CENTER PARK PROJECT



This spring, the City of Heath launched an exciting new project with the consulting firm of Kimley-Horn to provide a design for the Heath Towne Center, also known as the Towne Center Overlay District, and a design for Towne Center Park. You can keep up to date on this project and watch for important citizen surveys coming soon at DesignHTC.com.

The project is funded and directed by the Heath Economic Development Corporation/Heath Municipal Benefits Corporation (HEDC/HMBC) with a stakeholder committee that includes HEDC/HMBC Board members, City Council liaisons, City staff, HTC property owners and HTC businesses.

UPDATE: MARSHA'S HAPPY HAVEN AT TERRY PARK

For many years, Heath resident and former Park Board Chairman Ginny Jackson and supporters, including Heath resident Gini Seely, have shared a passion to create an inclusive haven where children can play and caregivers can rest and restore. Their vision took a big leap towards reality on August 27, 2019, when the Heath City Council dedicated a .54 acre parcel of land at the waterfront Terry Park for a privately-funded all abilities playground.

The concept design is situated on a small footprint on the north end of Terry Park and features play structures and elements that are wheelchair accessible, sensory friendly and safe for all. The features also allow wounded war veterans to enjoy some of the attractions and take part in playing with their children. Attractive shading and gating that enhances the lakefront setting will surround the playground to ensure each child's safety and every caregiver's peace-of-mind.

Official events and activities to raise funds for the playground were put on pause during the past year due to COVID-19, but you can make a contribution online at the non-profit's website, www.marshashappyhaven. com/donate. The estimated construction budget is \$1.2 million.


