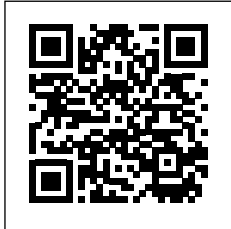

CITIZENS PROVIDE INPUT FOR THE DESIGN HEATH TOWNE CENTER AND TOWNE CENTER PARK PROJECT

The City of Heath continues to work with the consulting firm of Kimley-Horn to develop a design for the Heath Towne Center, also known as the Towne Center Overlay District, and a design for Towne Center Park.



The project included citizen surveys, and below are highlights of the responses. You can view the complete results and keep up to date on this project at DesignHTC.com by scanning the QR code.

The project is funded and directed by the Heath Economic Development Corporation/Heath Municipal Benefits Corporation (HEDC/HMBC). The Towne Center Park design is being spearheaded by the Park Board. The Towne Center Overlay District is driven by the HEDC/HMBC with a stakeholder committee that includes HEDC/HMBC Board members, City Council liaisons, City staff, HTC property owners and HTC businesses.

What are the top park features you feel are “Most Important” for the Towne Center Park improvements and additions:

1. Water features/splash space | 163 respondents (47.52%)
2. Shade | 154 respondents (44.90%)
3. Play equipment/playground | 144 respondents (41.98%)
4. Event/gathering space | 142 respondents (41.40%)
5. Beautification (plants, flowers) | 137 respondents (39.94%)

2021-2022 BUDGET PROCESS UNDERWAY

The City of Heath Council and staff have been working this summer to prepare a budget for the Fiscal Year 2021-2022. A public hearing to receive citizen input regarding the proposed budget is tentatively planned for the August 24 City Council Meeting.

A final budget is scheduled to be adopted by the City Council at its September 14 meeting, to become effective October 1.

HEATH DPS CAPTAIN JEVIN WOMACK RETIRES AFTER 25 YEARS OF SERVICE

On Friday, June 18, Heath DPS Captain Jevin Womack concluded his final shift and stepped into retirement after 25 years of service to the Heath community.

“Captain Womack has exemplified the highest ideals of public service during his tenure with the City of Heath, first as a volunteer, and finally as a Captain,” said Chief Brandon Seery. “We are going to miss him tremendously and wish him the greatest happiness and success in all of his future endeavors.”

Captain Womack began his career with the City of Heath as a volunteer firefighter in 1996. He later served as a reserve police officer for the City until he was hired full-time in 2001. This was prior to the department becoming a Department of Public Safety (DPS), in which all officers are triple certified as fire fighters, police officers and EMT’s.

In 2004, Captain Womack was a part of the transition to the DPS structure, and he is one of the last remaining members who worked the very first shifts as a police officer, firefighter and EMT. He has also served in many roles throughout the years, including a D.A.R.E. Officer, a School Resource Officer at Cain Middle School and Sergeant. In 2020, he was appointed as the first-ever Operations Captain in the department.

“Captain Womack’s leadership and service leave not only a lasting mark on the DPS, but in the community where he has played a lead role in ensuring the safe and peaceful quality of life that make Heath so special,” said City Manager Aretha Adams.

The newly-retired captain will now be able to help his wife, Pam, run their family business and spend more time with their children and grandchildren.

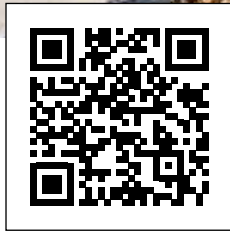


THANK YOU PATH MEMBERS
