NATIONAL PUBLIC WORKS WEEK IS MAY 15-21

The City of Heath will join communities around the country in honoring the staff members who play an important role in keeping our City safe and functioning smoothly during National Public Works Week, May 15-21. These professionals include employees who manage and maintain the City's water and sewer systems, streets, public buildings and parks. In short, these often "unsung" heroes maintain and improve systems and services that are vital to all citizens' health, safety and comfort.

"Our Public Works professionals are on call 24/7 to protect and serve our community, and we are grateful," said Mayor Kelson Elam. "They often work in very harsh conditions, from cold and ice to extreme heat, but they never complain as they focus on completing a long list of important jobs."

Mayor Kelson Elam will issue a proclamation in honor of the City of Heath Public Works Department at the City Council meeting on May 10, and staff will be treated to lunch during the week.

RESPECT. HONOR. REMEMBER NATIONAL POLICE WEEK IS MAY 15-21



The three candidates will take the Oath of Office at the City Council meeting on May 10, and we thank them for their service!

NATIONAL COFFEE WITH A COP INITIATIVE COMES TO HEATH



BEFORE YOU BUILD IT, FIX IT OR INSTALL IT... FIRST CHECK IF YOU NEED A PERMIT FOR IT

You can find the details on construction and home improvement projects requiring a City permit at heathtx.com under Departments-Building Inspections. These projects include fences, retaining walls 4' or higher, pools, irrigation systems, interior remodeling and additions, outdoor kitchens and fireplaces, roofing, window replacements, foundation repair, OSSF replacements/repairs, and plumbing, electrical or mechanical work. Fines up to \$500 apply to violations.

HISTORY FAQS: HOW HEATH GOT ITS NAME

- Heath was named for John O. Heath, who in 1846 became one of the earliest settlers in the area.
- Heath was originally known as Black Hills a reference to the black soil of the area.
- Heath received a post office in 1849, which was the first in what is now Rockwall County.
- In 1854, the post office was moved to Rockwall, and from this time until 1886, the settlement was known as Willow Springs, taking the name from a local stream.
- In 1886, the name officially became Heath, when it again received a
 post office that operated until 1906.
