AVOID MESSY PROBLEMS BY PROPERLY DISPOSING OF HOLIDAY COOKING FATS, OILS AND GREASE (FOG)

FOG is the residue left over from all that cooking with meats, butter, lard, sauces, dressing, dairy products and oil. FOG and other debris poured down the drain can build up in pipes and cause backups in both private and City-maintained sewer systems.

To avoid expensive plumbing repairs and damage to the sewer system:

- Scrape or wipe cooled grease or fat from all cookware and place in the trash.
- Pour or scrape melted grease into a sturdy closed-lid container and dispose of the sealed container in the trash.
- You can also use the City of Heath's Household Hazardous Waste front porch collection for disposal of the sealed container.
