SOLID WASTE AND HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE FEE INCREASES DUE TO INFLATION

Monthly fees for City of Heath residents for collection of solid waste will be increased starting February 2023 due to inflation.

The City of Heath contract with solid waste service provider, Waste Connections, and Household Hazardous Waste service provider, HHW Solutions, both provide for fee increases as reflected in the Consumer Price Index for the Dallas-Fort Worth Metropolitan area.

Due to inflation, basic residential solid waste monthly fees will rise from \$21.48 per month to \$23.39 per month. The household hazardous waste fee will rise from 56-cents per month to 70-cents per month. The increase for other solid waste fees are available for review on the City website via the QR code on the right.





WEEKLY HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

Weekly "front porch pickup" of household hazardous wastes items is available to Heath utility customers through HHW Solutions. Items collected include paint, motor oil, batteries, insecticides, fertilizers, pool chemicals and other household materials.

Customers can also set out up to 50 pounds of electronic items to be recycled. You do not have to be home to have items collected.

CITY AMENDS AND APPROVES FLOODPLAIN ORDINANCE

On December 12, 2022, the City Council approved Ordinance No. 221213A, amending the City's floodplain ordinance to come into compliance with recent floodplain mapping changes in Kaufman County by FEMA. The Ordinance became effective on January 12, 2023.

Adoption of this Ordinance allows the citizens of Heath to continue participation in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). The NFIP has two purposes: to share the risk of flood losses through flood insurance and to reduce flood damages by restricting floodplain development. FEMA floodplain maps for Heath, in Rockwall and Kaufman Counties, and the amended Ordinance are available on the City of Heath website, along with contact information for questions about the floodplain.

COLD & CONSTRUCTION: A combination for increased coyote sightings

Cold weather combined with construction creep emboldens wildlife to come closer to our homes looking for sustenance. While Heath is a semirural community, even suburbs like Plano experience an increase in coyote and bob cat activity during the winter.

Here are several ways to make your property (and small pets) less attractive to pest and predator animals:

- Do not leave pet and livestock food dishes out in the open
- Mow down tall grass
- Keep pets indoors and supervise them when they go out
- Enclose your compost piles
- Seal up any openings under your deck, porch, or shed

INSTALL FENCING

Fencing is the best way to keep your pets in, and coyotes out. Coyotes can jump high, and will dig as well, so fencing should be at least 6 feet tall, and buried a few inches into the ground. Some people also opt for electric fencing.

INSTALL SOLAR LED DETERRENT OR MOTION DETECTOR LIGHTS

LED predator deterrent lights for predators can help to scare coyotes (and other nocturnal predators and pest animals) away from your property. The coyotes will mistake the twin LED lights for the flickering eyes of another unknown predator. Google: predator deterrent lighting.

GOLF CARTS & MOTORIZED VEHICLES: A FRIENDLY REMINDER FROM THE HEATH DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

One of the more frequent calls to Heath DPS involves the use of golf carts or other motorized vehicles on City sidewalks and trails. Below is a recap of what is allowed and prohibited. If you have additional questions, please call the non-emergency Heath DPS number at 972-771-7724.

The Operation of Golf Carts is Allowed:

- On roads with a 35-mile-per-hour or less speed limit;
- During daylight hours;
- Within five miles of where the golf cart is housed; and
- Headed to or from a golf course.

Texas Law Requires:

- That the operator of a golf cart possess a valid driver's license; and
- Golf carts be equipped with headlamps, tail lamps, reflectors, mirrors and a parking brake.

Prohibited:

•

• The use of ANY motorized vehicle on any City trail system or park.

Violators of the restrictions listed are subject to fines or other penalties. This includes a person, such as a parent, allowing an unauthorized driver to operate a motorized vehicle. Thank you for helping to keep Heath safe for pedestrians!
