CITY BREAKS GROUND ON PLAZA PARK IN THE HEART OF TOWN

The City of Heath hosted a groundbreaking ceremony on December 13 for a plaza park at FM 740/FM 550/FM 549 that will provide more open space and a beautiful entry feature for the downtown area.

The project was initiated in 2022, when the Heath Economic Development/Municipal Benefits Corporation (HEDC/HMBC) purchased the parkland, which was formerly TxDOT right-ofway left over from the widening of the FM 740 project. By law, the County, RISD and City have the first rights in that order to purchase surplus TxDOT property.

The purpose of the HEDC/HMBC is to support initiatives that expand the sales tax base and quality of life in Heath through economic development that fits the culture of the City.

This investment will enhance business in the retail center by offering customers a place to enjoy before, during and after a visit to any of the establishments. The plaza is also accessible by biking or walking via City trails.

Weather permitting, the plaza park will be completed in the Spring of 2024.

City Project Update

BOND FUNDING PAVES WAY FOR CITY IMPROVEMENTS WITHOUT IMPACTING TAX RATE

In December 2023, City Council approved the issuance of a \$30-million-bond package to fund the three infrastructure projects listed below. The Heath Economic Benefits Corporation (HMBC) approved participating in the funding by contributing a lump sum of \$3 million and paying the annual debt service for the Public Safety Station. As a result, there is no impact to citizens' tax rate to achieve these community improvements.

1. Towne Center Park Renovation

The renovation of Town Center Park will include new amenities such as pickle ball courts, basketball courts, a stage for events and field improvements. The park will be irrigated by a well on the property and showcase drought-tolerant plants and landscaping techniques as a model for water conservation citywide. The project will begin this winter.

2. New Department of Public Safety Station

A fire station study completed in 2023 illustrated the critical need for a second public safety station. The bond package provides for the construction of a new facility. The location and design of the new station are now being finalized.

3. New Public Works Facility

Another critical need to be addressed in 2024 is the construction of a new Public Works facility to safely house the City's investment in equipment and staff. The new facility will be built on land currently owned by the City on FM 740.

ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TARA PLEXICO NAMED 2023 CITYWIDE EMPLOYEE OF THE YEAR

WASTE COLLECTION FEES INCREASED

The City's trash/recycling and household hazardous waste collection providers requested a rate increase effective February 1 due to inflation-related cost increases as reflected in the Consumer Price Index for the DFW area. The City's 2024 Fee Schedule has been amended to accommodate this request.

The residential base rate for solid waste collection will increase from \$21.36 per month to \$22.33 per month.

The base service fee for the weekly front porch household hazardous waste pick up will increase from \$1.08 per home per month to \$1.13 per home per month. Each weekly pickup remains free. Use the QR code to learn how to take advantage of this service.

PHASE 2 OF HUBBARD DRIVE PROJECT UNDERWAY

In November 2023, Hubbard Drive from Scenic Place to Scenic drive was closed to traffic for construction of Phase 2.

Traffic has been detoured using Scenic Drive and Scenic Place as the travel route. Phase 2 construction is projected to be completed in May.

The final two phases of this community improvement are:

- Phase 3 Rush Creek to Michael Lane
- Phase 4 Michael Lane to almost FM 740/Smirl



PURSUIT OF SECONDARY WATER SOURCE AND REDUNDANCY CONTINUES

COUNCIL RECEIVES SECOND REPORT FROM CONSULTANTS CONDUCTING WATER STUDY

City Council received the second report from the consultants performing the water study at the January 9 meeting after this newsletter went to print. You can find the report and listen to the presentation and discussion at www.heathtx.com under Government. Report highlights will also be included in next month's newsletter.

The first water study report was provided at the December 12 City Council meeting, which you can also find and listen to under the Government menu. The consultants outlined steps being taken to identify and communicate with alternate providers of water.

Additionally, Council approved the purchase and installation of a new 300 HP water pump to provide equipment redundancy and expand pumping capabilities.

NEW WATER CONSERVATION STANDARDS FOR LANDSCAPING AND IRRIGATION

The City of Heath enacted a temporary residential and commercial building moratorium on November 14, 2023. The pause provides time to develop ordinances that support water conservation including landscaping and irrigation system requirements as population growth increases the demand for a finite supply.

The new development standards will include the use of vegetation to protect foundations, improved irrigation systems and drought-tolerant landscaping.

The moratorium does not affect any property development already in progress as of November 14, 2023.

NORTH TEXAS MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT (NTMWD) **IMPLEMENTS YEAR-ROUND CONSERVATION SCHEDULE**



The City of Heath's water supplier -- North Texas Municipal Water District (NTMWD) via the City of Rockwall - has implemented a year-round, two-day-a-week irrigation schedule for all end-users.

The City of Heath has adopted this model as requested by the NTMWD.

WATERING RESTRICTIONS

- Landscape watering with sprinklers or irrigation systems at each service address is limited to TWICE PER WEEK ON YOUR DESIGNATED DAY.
- Foundations, trees and other plantings may be watered any day with soaker or handheld hoses.
- No watering (including by irrigation systems, handheld hoses or soaker hoses) may occur between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day.
- Restrictions are mandatory and violations are subject to fines.

LAST NUMBER OF HOUSE ADDRESS DAY OF WEEK WATERING IS ALLOWED:

For example, if your house number is 1265 your designated day is Wednesday.

HEATH SCAN – SAFE CITIZENS ALERT NETWORK

The City of Heath operates a QR code-based emergency communication program called SCAN: Safe Citizens Alert Network. While residents are urged to sign up for Rockwall County's free NIXLE



alert system, HEATH SCAN is in place to quickly distribute emergency information that is specific to Heath citizens without reliance upon third party sources.

SCAN also provides an easy way to use your phone to access this information, which is critical when devices such as desktop computers are not available due to power outages. SCAN the QR Code with your phone to go directly to the SCAN emergency page on the City's website that will be activated to provide real-time information as necessary.
