

HEATH ADOPTS FY 2023-2024 CITY BUDGET: Sixth consecutive year tax rate is lowered

The City Council adopted the FY 2023-2024 City of Heath Annual Budget at the Regular City Council meeting on September 26 following months of work held in open meetings and a Public Hearing on September 25.

The budget became effective October 1 and is based on a tax rate of \$0.277493, which is 0.013682 cents lower than last year's tax rate of \$0.291175 or 4.70%. This is the sixth consecutive year the City's tax rate has been lowered for a total decrease of 13.9818 cents or 33.51%



The budget incorporates \$30.5 million in bonds to fund the construction of a new Department of Public Safety station and a Public Works facility, and the renovation of Towne Center Park. Due to a funding partnership between the Heath Municipal Benefits Corporation (HMBC) and the City, these projects will be funded without an increase to the tax rate.

The bonds issued will not affect the City's ability to fund future water infrastructure projects to expand the City's water storage and delivery capacity. A water study is currently underway, with the first report by the consulting firm expected at the December 12 City Council meeting.

Additional services in the new budget include increased funding for payas-you-go programs; street repairs and improvements; drainage repairs and improvements; water and sewer infrastructure improvements; and the addition of two seasonal park maintenance workers, a part-time custodian, a meter services supervisor, a water production and lift station supervisor and two part-time seasonal administrative assistants.

"This is the sixth year in a row that we have achieved a balanced budget that addresses our City's needs without raising taxes," said Mayor Kelson Elam. "As property values have increased, we have adjusted the tax rate to stay flat, and I thank our Council and staff for their hard work on behalf of our citizens."

CITY INITIATES ANNUAL WATER CONSERVATION: CUSTOMERS CAN WATER TWICE PER WEEK

The Annual Water Conservation Schedule allows customers to use irrigation systems to water twice per week on their assigned days (see schedule). The Annual Water Conservation Schedule is required of North Texas Water Municipal District (NTWMD) for all member cities and requested of customer cities (which includes the City of Heath).

As climate and growth continue to place great demands on a limited supply of water, the City of Heath joins North Texas cities in adhering to this conservation schedule year-round.

Any changes would be to increase restrictions if demand pushes the daily limit of 6 million gallons allowed to the City of Heath by the City of Rockwall.

Thank you for your cooperation and continued efforts.

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE:

The City of Heath has initiated a water study to identify additional sources of water and the infrastructure needed for storage and delivery. The first report on this effort is expected at the December 12 City Council meeting.

Additionally, City staff members are working to bring to City Council a series of ordinances to address water usage for both existing and future development which includes a landscaping ordinance that would require the installation of drought tolerant landscaping and turf and encourage Xeriscaping to minimize irrigation water demand from future construction.
